Applicants should be able to submit one of the two: a foreign passport <i>or</i> a consular ID card. Getting both can be prohibitively expensive and impossible for some. We encourage the DMV to use non-electronic means to verify passports and consular IDs if electronic verification is not in place by 1/1/2015.
