Relief Sought

- 1. To issue a temporary restraining order restraining Defendant City of Fresno, including the Fresno Police Department and the Community Sanitation Division of the City of Fresno, from taking and destroying property that they know or reasonably should know is the property of the homeless, including but not limited to their tents, clothing, personal effects, carts and other related property pending the hearing on and determination of Plaintiffs' Motion for Preliminary Injunction.
- 2. To issue a preliminary injunction restraining Defendant City of Fresno, including the Fresno Police Department and the Community Sanitation Division of the City of Fresno, from taking and destroying property that they know or reasonably should know is the property of the homeless, including but not limited to their tents, clothing, personal effects, carts and other related property.

Grounds for Motion

1. The grounds for this motion, as more fully set forth in the verified complaint, the Memorandum of Points and Authorities filed herewith and the Declarations of Michael Rhodes, Pamela Kincaid, Joanna Garcia, Doug Deatherage, Randy Johnson, Charlene Clay, Cynthia Greene, Samuel Vizcarrondo, Tracy Williams and Liza Apper are that:

Defendants, including but not limited to City of Fresno, the Fresno Police Department, the Community Sanitation Division of the City of Fresno and other Fresno City employees, go to places where homeless people are found in the City of Fresno and systematically seize and destroy all of Plaintiffs' personal property, including their tents, clothing, shoes, personal effects and related property essential to their ability to survive. They do so even though the property is clearly not abandoned and even though Plaintiffs and/or members of the Plaintiff Class plead to be allowed to save or retrieve their personal property. No

provision to allow Plaintiffs or members of the Plaintiff Class to claim or retrieve their possessions is made; to the contrary, their property is taken and immediately destroyed.

- 2. No valid or lawful basis exists for all the personal possessions of the homeless Plaintiffs. The confiscation and immediate destruction of Plaintiffs' personal possessions which include their shelter (such as a tent, their clothing, shoes and other essentials of life as well as personal effects, photographs and documents). Plaintiffs have not abandoned their property and there is no basis to presume otherwise.
- 3. The continuing destruction of Plaintiffs' personal property, including their shelter, clothing, personal effects and related property will cause immediate and irreparable injury to the plaintiff. The declarations of Michael Rhodes, Pamela Kincaid, Joanna Garcia, Doug Deatherage, Randy Johnson, Charlene Clay, Cynthia Greene, Samuel Vizcarrondo, Tracy Williams and Liza Apper show the nature of the conduct and the irreparable harm that has been and will continue to be suffered by Plaintiffs absent an order of this Court.
- 4. Unless the operation and enforcement of the order is restrained pending final disposition of the action, the injury to Plaintiffs in the interim will be irreparable even if the final judgment is for the Plaintiffs.
- 5. No injury will be sustained by the Defendants or by the public through issuance of a temporary restraining order.

This motion is based on the Motion papers, including this document, the Certificate of Counsel, the attached Memorandum of Points and Authorities, the supporting Declarations of Michael Rhodes, Pamela Kincaid, Joanna Garcia, Doug Deatherage, Randy Johnson, Charlene Clay, Cynthia Greene, Samuel Vizcarrondo, Tracy Williams, and Liza Apper, as well as the verified complaint and all other papers and records on file in this action, together with any argument and evidence that may be presented at the hearing of this motion.
