By changing this crime from a felony to misdemeanor, we can still hold individuals accountable for their actions while taking a huge burden off of state prisons. This would save billions of dollars, money that could fill the budget shortfall or that could be invested in schools, health care, and local law enforcement.

[SOME PEOPLE SAY/OTHER PEOPLE SAY] treating people whose crime was possession of a small amount of drugs for personal use like hardened criminals by sending them to state prison for up to three years is wrong. State prisons are notorious for violence, rape, and disease and there is little, if any, drug treatment. Prison is the worst possible environment for people struggling with addiction. And after prison, the punishment continues. The consequences of a felony conviction are severe and life-long, including reduced access to job opportunities, student loans, and small business loans. The right thing to do is to treat these offenses as misdemeanors and hold people accountable to the community at the local level, with drug treatment, probation, or county jail.
